- If you left UA on academic probation (GPA below 2.0) or were disqualified from UA or any U.S. institution, your application will be referred to the college and/or you may be required to submit a degree-seeking application for admission consideration.
- Non-degree students are not eligible for on-campus housing (with the exception of National Student Exchange students) or financial aid (including grants, scholarships, loans or work study), or Upper Division courses without the consent of the department.
- You may apply up to 15 credits taken as a non-degree-seeking student toward UA degree requirements.

SPECIFIC UA NON-DEGREE-SEEKING STUDENT PROGRAMS

Early Start Middle East Studies Class

Early Start is a program for students at Cholla High School, enrolled in the high school Middle East Studies class, who wish to take the class for UA credit (MENA 277B or MENA 160A-2). Eligibility for enrollment is determined by the instructor.

Engineering 102 for High School Students*

Engineering 102 HS is an opportunity for high school juniors and seniors, enrolled in Pre-Calculus, Calculus I or above, to receive college credit while still in high school. The course 'Engineering 102' introduces students to the fundamental principles of engineering design. This introductory course teaches students how teamwork, communication and design techniques can be applied to a variety of engineering problems. The course also provides students with a perspective on the various engineering disciplines, which helps them select an engineering degree program that best fits their skills and interests. <http://engineering.arizona.edu/102highschool>

German 101

This program is available to Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors in High School. Prerequisites: B or better in both semesters of German I and teacher permission. This is a one year course that fulfills the Foreign Language or an Elective credit for high school graduation AND 4 credit hours from the University of Arizona upon successful completion. This is a college level beginning German course designed to introduce the German language and culture, while developing basic communication skills for new German language learners.

Jumpstart for High School Students*

This summer program provides high school juniors and seniors with the opportunity to explore university-level instruction by enrolling in general education courses at the University of Arizona. For a reduced tuition, students will earn 3-5 units of academic credit that will count toward their eventual UA degree! Course options include ARB 101 an 102, MAS 105B and GEOG 197F.

Molecular and Cellular Biology (MCB103)- KEYS Keep Engaging Youth in Science for High School Students*

KEYS interns enroll, with no tuition costs, in the University of Arizona during their summer break for a week of intensive laboratory and science literacy training, followed by six weeks in the laboratory of a renowned UA researcher.
